- 1826, 7 August      Built by the Hudson's Bay Company at Fort Vancouver, launched (E.E. Rich, *History...*, p. 612)
- 1827                      Operating with temporary sails (B.223/c/1 fos. 4-6)
- 1828                      Appears on Wilson's list (Dick Wilson, Appendix I)
- 1829, Fall              Hauled up to be repaired, placed on blocks, timbers decayed (C.1/219)
- 1830, March            Lost in Spring flood of the Columbia River (C.1/219)
- 1832                      Transporting empty barrels from Fort Vancouver to Pillar Rock (B.223/b/8 fos. 8d-9)
- 1836                      Carried supplies to the *Ganymede* (B.223/b/15 fo. 8d)
